Dear Chairmen Walden and Murphy:

Thank you for the opportunity to share with you the importance of the 340B program for Parkland Health & Hospital System patients. We appreciate the committee's interest in ensuring the integrity of the program and stand ready to assist you with your efforts. As you noted in your letter, the intent of the program is to assist safety-net hospitals stretch limited federal funding for the purposes of helping vulnerable patients gain better access to healthcare. This response letter will demonstrate how the 340B program directly supports critical services for our patients who are uninsured and underinsured.

Located in Dallas County, Texas, Parkland is one of the busiest safety-net health systems in the country and one of the largest providers of uncompensated care in the state of Texas. Parkland is home to premier services such as a Level I trauma center, the largest Level III neonatal intensive care unit in North Texas and the second largest civilian burn center in the nation. In addition, Parkland serves as the primary teaching hospital for The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center. Our extensive outreach to the community includes care in 12 Community Oriented Primary Care health centers, 12 Youth & Family centers, 10 women's health centers, acute response clinics, homeless outreach mobile units and nursing homes. We also administer healthcare to inmates in the Dallas County Jail.

Our mission is to care for the indigent and uninsured residing in Dallas County. In FY2016, the system provided \$871 million in uncompensated care. Parkland's payor mix is 38 percent charity, 28 percent Medicaid, 16 percent Medicare, 10 percent self-pay and 8 percent Commercial insurance. Last year, we provided more than 1 million outpatient visits, filled over 9 million inpatient and outpatient medication orders and spent more than \$100 million in pharmaceutical costs. While the minimum DSH percentage required for hospitals to qualify for 340B drug pricing is 11.75 percent, Parkland's DSH percentage is 49.2 percent. Without the 340B program, Parkland would be unable to provide this level of care to our community.

(f). The amount of charity care (in dollars) that your organization provided;

While some organizations will report charity care as the amount of charges the institution generates for charity care, that representation overstates the actual costs. We are reporting actual costs to Parkland. In 2016, Parkland provided over \$431 million in charity care. Additionally, Parkland provided another \$109 million in services to individuals who are uninsured but do not qualify for Parkland's Financial Assistance Program. In addition Parkland experienced \$263 million in Medicaid shortfall – i.e., actual costs for care to Medicaid beneficiaries that is over the amount of reimbursement from Medicaid. Parkland receives reimbursement for 25% of this uncompensated care and Medicaid shortfall from state and federal sources of supplemental funding and the balance is supported through county funds.

(g). The number of patients that received charity care from your organization.

That same year, 97,200 unique patients received charity. Most of these patients qualify for Parkland's Patient Financial Assistance Program.

2. How does your organization calculate the amount of savings it generates through participation in the 340B Drug Pricing Program?

For each drug bought at a 340B price for a given time frame, we calculate our cost savings by taking the difference between the 340B price and the next available best price (usually GPO cost) and then summing all values. This sum is the total 340B savings for the time period.

How does your organization track the amount of money your organization receives when an insured patients' insurance reimbursement exceeds the 340B price paid for the drug?

We do not currently track this data because the actual insurance reimbursement per patient is not received at the time of dispensation. Additional resources would be required to track each drug and compare to reimbursement at the patient account level. Tracking 340B drugs in this manner would be overly burdensome and redirect resources away from patient care.

3. How does your organization use program savings to care for vulnerable populations?

Parkland's mission is to provide care for the indigent and uninsured. 340B savings provide access to care for low-income individuals through our Patient Financial Assistance Program (outlined in 3a). Additionally, savings are used for programs such as:

- Provision of homeless medical outreach services for Dallas County
- Free or very low copay prescriptions to low-income, uninsured, and underinsured patients, which help improve a patient's quality of care, quality of life, and assist in preventing costly hospital admissions
- Outpatient Antibiotic Therapy Clinic and home IV antibiotic therapy for patients needing a longer duration of treatment, which help decrease hospital treatment costs
- Pharmacist based anticoagulation drug therapy management clinics and asthma education & drug therapy management
- Other services benefiting from the savings includes our Level 1 Trauma Center, Level III NICU, burn center, and our community clinics.

Are program savings used for any other purpose?

Program savings go directly into system operations to meet the health care needs of our community. This includes providing access to care to low income patients. Each year, we scale our services according to available budget.

a. Does your organization provide any additional charity care to uninsured and underinsured patients with funds derived from sources other than the 340B Drug Pricing Program? If so, please elaborate.

Yes, Parkland's Financial Assistance Program (PFA) provides financial assistance for medical care to Dallas County residents who are indigent and unable to qualify for Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP or Marketplace insurance. PFA allows patients to receive medically necessary care across our system including: inpatient and outpatient care, primary and preventive services, family planning, laboratory, and pharmacy services.

Additional revenue sources used to cover costs of the uninsured and underinsured:

- Dallas County Hospital District property tax
- Medicare revenue
- Medicaid revenue including supplemental payment programs (DSH, 1115 waiver, etc.)
- Parkland Foundation
- Family planning grants
- Patient Vendor Drug Assistance programs

b. What percentage of total health care services provided by your organization is charity care?

The total health care cost for unfunded patients is 43%. Although we receive very little reimbursement from uninsured patients in families earning greater than 200% FPL, we do treat them as "self-pay" and not "charity" care. A total of twenty-nine percent of the health care services we provide is for uninsured individuals in family earning less than 200% FPL which we define as "charity care" and for whom we provide sliding scale assistance up to 100%.

4. Does your organization have any policies to help ensure that uninsured and underinsured patients directly benefit from the program by receiving discounts on 340B drugs? If so, please elaborate.

At Parkland, eligible patients are assigned financial classifications based on income and Federal Poverty Levels. These plans are associated with very low or no medical visit co-payments. Prescriptions generated from Parkland visits are 340B eligible to be filled at Parkland pharmacies.

Parkland has a low pharmacy medication copay structure: no charge, \$5.00, \$7.00, or \$8.00 depending on the patient's financial classification, regardless of the cost of medication. Parkland also provides a mail order prescription service to help assist patients in obtaining their medications. Mail order copays are \$5.00 or \$10.00 for a one or three month supply, respectively. If a patient is unable to afford their copay and are under a Parkland financial plan classification, the copays are reduced or waived to assist the patient in obtaining their prescription.

5. How many child-sites does your organization have registered to participate in the 340B Drug Pricing Program? Please provide a list of all child-sites, including the location of the child-site and the date it began participating in the program.

Parkland has 100 child sites belonging to the organization. Included with these are 7 homeless outreach sites (1 parent FQHC + 6 child sites) and 10 family planning registered sites. All sites belong to the Dallas County Hospital District and are clinically integrated with our parent site. A list of child-sites is included in **Attachment A**.

6. How many pharmacies has your organization contracted with to dispense drugs purchased through the 340B Drug Pricing Program on your behalf?

We do not currently have any 340B pharmacy contract arrangements.

(a) Do your contracts with these pharmacies require that program savings be passed on to the intended beneficiaries, including requiring that uninsured or underinsured patients receive discounts on 340B drugs?

As you can see by this letter, the 340B program is essential for Parkland to offer critical care to patients who are low income. Benefits of the program are reinvested directly in our system of care serving a very high percentage of low income uninsured and Medicaid beneficiaries.
